

HPIO 2017 *Health Value Dashboard*
Access Metric Selection Workgroup
Meeting One: Pre-meeting materials (April 7, 2016)

Workgroup purpose: Review the list of metrics in the [Access](#) domain from the *2014 Dashboard* and identify any needed changes for the *2017 Dashboard*.

Workgroup objectives:

1. Keep consistency as much as possible in the metrics included in the *2014 Dashboard* and the new *2017 Dashboard* so that we are able to track and evaluate Ohio's progress for each metric over time AND compare Ohio's performance to other states.
2. Improve on the Access domain's metrics as deemed appropriate using the [metric selection criteria](#) to "make the case" for adding a new metric.
3. Maintain a set of concise metrics to track Access in the *2017 Dashboard*. If the Workgroup decides that a new metric should be included in the Access domain, the Workgroup will need to identify an existing metric within the Access domain that this new metric will replace.

To prepare for Meeting One, please:

1. Familiarize yourself with the list of metrics in the [Access](#) domain.
2. Review the [metric selection criteria](#) and the "[bike rack/wish list](#)".

Consider: Are there any metrics on the bike rack/wish list that are now available and should be included in the 2017 Dashboard? Note that the metrics for underserved for primary, dental and mental health care were actually included in the 2014 Dashboard.

3. Review the conceptual framework *stages in the life course* diagram below.

Consider: Do you think the current set of metrics reflects a good balance across the life course? If not, what's missing in the Access domain?

4. Review the Access Metric data Excel Sheet [attached to this email](#). Specifically, review the [cells highlighted in yellow](#).

Consider: Are there any other sources or metrics that provide more recent data for metrics where data is not updated? If not, how should we proceed with these metrics?

Are there other metrics you would recommend to include in the Access domain?

Please come prepared to discuss your thoughts on the above questions during Meeting One. Also, please remember that anytime you are recommending a metric for addition to the Dashboard you will need to:

1. Identify which existing metric the new metric should replace.
2. Provide a **link** or **source** where we can find state-level data for the new metric.
3. "Make the case" for the metric using the [metric selection criteria](#).
