Speaker biographies

Kevin Barnett

As a Senior Investigator at the Public Health Institute, Kevin has engaged in research in community benefit and health workforce diversity for over two decades. Partners have included the National Network of Public Health Institutes, the Health Research and Education Trust, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the HHS Office of Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships, and foundations such as the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the WK Kellogg Foundation, and The California Endowment.

Kevin currently serves as the Principal Investigator of Alignment for Health Equity and Development (AHEAD), a national initiative funded by the Kresge Foundation to align and focus investments by hospitals, public health, and financial institutions in communities with health disparities.

He also serves as the Co-Director of the California Health Workforce Alliance, as a faculty member for The

Governance Institute, as a member of the Advisory Board for the Institute for Culturally Competent Care at Kaiser Permanente, as a member of the Board of Directors of Communities Joined in Action, and as a member of the Board of Directors for the Trinity Health System.

Greg Moody

Governor John R. Kasich appointed Greg Moody in January 2011 to lead the Office of Health Transformation. OHT is responsible for advancing Governor Kasich's Medicaid modernization and cost-containment priorities, engaging private sector partners to improve overall health system performance, and recommending a permanent health and human services structure for Ohio. Greg began his public service career as a budget associate for the U.S. House Budget Committee in Washington D.C. The Budget Chairman at the time, Rep. John Kasich, asked Greg to study the impact of Medicaid

on federal spending – an assignment that set the course for his public policy career.

Prior to joining the Kasich Administration, Greg was a senior consultant at Health Management Associates, a national research and consulting firm that specializes in complex health care program and policy issues. He worked with clients to improve Medicaid system performance, and wrote extensively about state health system innovations for the Commonwealth Fund, National Governor's Association, and other foundations. Greg's Ohio experience includes serving as Interim Director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (2001), Executive Assistant for Health and Human Services for Governor Bob Taft (1999-2004), and Chief of Staff to the Dean at the OSU College of Medicine (1997-1999). Greg has a Masters in Philosophy from George Washington University and Bachelors in Economics from Miami University.
