

WHAT CRITERIA WOULD YOU LIKE A PHYSICIAN TO USE IN DECIDING HOW TO TREAT YOU?

- 1. Intuition (gut feeling) about what will be effective
- What they have heard from co-workers is effective
- 3. Past experience with similar situations
- Results of controlled experimental studies that show a method is helpful
- 5. What they know by critically reading the literature in their field


- Scope/content area




WHAT WORKS FOR HEALTH EVIDENCE RATINGS

 - Peer-reviewed
 - Grey literature
 - Rating organizations
- Considerations
 - Number of studies
 - Type of studies
 - Study quality


