### South Carolina NFP

- 2009 Launch (6 Implementing Agencies (IA), 600 Families)
- 2010-2011 MIECHV Expansion (Growth in Existing IAs, plus 1 new IA)
- 2012-2013 MIECHV + Private Expansion (2 IAs)
- 2016 Private Expansion (1 IA)
- 10 IAs, 52 Nurse Home Visitors, 1,200 Families
