# Speaker biographies

### Rep. Doug Green

Chairman of the Ohio House Transportation and Public Safety Committee, Ohio House of Representatives

State Rep. Doug Green is currently serving his fourth term at the Ohio House of Representatives. He represents the 66th District, which includes all of Brown County, as well as southeastern Clermont County.

Prior to serving in the House, Rep. Green served as the auditor of Brown County, where he has been an elected official for 28 years. Other jobs he has held include his work at Saul's Construction in Clermont County, the Ohio Department of Transportation, Trinity Industries in Mt. Orab and the Brown County Habilitation Center.

Rep. Green, who was one of seven children, comes from a family that has been active in farming, operating a small family business and serving their community.

### Christopher Koller, MA

### President, Milbank Memorial Fund

Christopher F. Koller is president of the Milbank Memorial Fund. Before joining the Fund, he served the state of Rhode Island as the country's first health insurance commissioner, an appointment he held from March of 2005 through June of 2013. Under Mr. Koller's leadership, the R.I. Office of the Health Insurance Commissioner was nationally recognized for its rate review process and its efforts to use insurance regulation to promote payment reform, primary care revitalization, and delivery system transformation. The Office was also one of the lead agencies in implementing the Affordable Care Act in Rhode Island.

Prior to serving as health insurance commissioner, Mr. Koller was the CEO of Neighborhood Health Plan of Rhode Island for nine years. In this role he was the founding chair of the Association of Community Affiliated Plans. Mr. Koller has a bachelor's degree, summa cum laude, from Dartmouth College and master's degrees in management and religion from Yale University. He was a member of the IOM Committee on Essential Health Benefits and serves in numerous national and state health policy advisory capacities. Mr. Koller is also adjunct professor of community health in the School of Public Health at Brown University.

### Mei Wa Kwong, JD

### **Executive Director, Center for Connected Health Policy**

Mei Wa Kwong joined CCHP in March 2010 as a Policy Associate and was named Executive Director in January 2018. Ms. Kwong leads the organization's work on public policy issues as they impact telehealth on the state and federal level. She is also the project director for the National Telehealth Policy Resource Center.

Ms. Kwong is a nationally recognized expert on telehealth policy. In her current role at CCHP she works with the organization's multitude of national and regional partners on telehealth issues and oversees CCHP's projects, provides policy technical assistance to state and federal lawmakers, industry members, providers, consumers and others. She manages CCHP's staff and works closely with CCHP's consultants. She has been published in peer review journals and is a sought after speaker at national conferences.

Prior to joining CCHP, Ms. Kwong was a public policy analyst for Children's Home Society of California, working on child care and early education issues on the state and federal levels. She also worked extensively with the Child Development Policy Institute, a statewide public policy organization, and was recognized by them in 2004 for her work in the early care and education field. She was at the National Association of Real Estate Investment Trusts in Washington, D.C. working on federal tax issues, and administered the association's political action committee. Ms. Kwong holds a BA in International Affairs from George Washington University, and a JD from George Washington University Law School.

### **Brandi Braun**

### Deputy Innovation Officer, City of Columbus

Brandi Braun is the Deputy Innovation Officer for the City of Columbus where she leads external affairs, government relations, communications and strategic planning efforts for Smart Columbus, an initiative born from the Smart City Challenge Grant, where Columbus beat out 77 other cities from across the country. Brandi also helps lead enterprise-wide innovation strategies aimed at improving efficiency and effectiveness throughout the City.
